About the Organizers :

Gokhale Education Society established in 1918 and the parent body of NBT Law College is in its Centenary year. Gosavi, Director & Secretary, Gokhale Education Society, Nashik who is a globally acclaimed educationist.

NBT Law college is one of its institutions in existence from 1969. It is the first Law college in Northern Maharashtra, it is one of the few colleges in Maharashtra having 15 full time qualified permanent faculty. It is also ISO certified and NAAC accredited, the college played a very significant role in legal education which is evident from its rich alumni. The college includes the majority of advocates practicing in Nashik Bar Association and neighboring Moffusil courts. Our alumni includes Justice Makrand Karnik Judge, Bombay High Court & approx 80 sitting Judges all over Maharashtra. Mr. Jayant Jaibhave member of BCI legal education and Mr. Avinash Bhide Chairman of Bar Council of Maharashtra & Goa are also our illustrious alumni.

The above mentioned competition is a joint effort of G. E. Society's N. B. Thakur Law College, Nashik and Adv. D. T. Jaibhave Pratishthan, Nashik founded in the memory of Late Adv. D. T. Jaibhave who was an eminent advocate practicing in the trial court of Nashik and other stalwart advocates who have established a 'high heritage of practice of law' in a trial court at Nashik.

This competition is being conducted here since 2006, to promote the importance of application of law amongst the law students and is aimed at giving a law student the experience of conducting a trial in the role of advocates and judges, with a vision to establish trial court practice which forms the foundation of the legal practice in India.



Rules and Regulations for Competition:

Eligibility & Registration:

1. Teams from Law Colleges recognized by Bar Council of India will be eligible to participate in the competition.
2. The members of each team should be enrolled for undergraduate Law course either pursuing 3 years or 5 years Law course.
3. Each team shall pay registration fees of Rs.500/- by cash on the day of the competition.
4. Each team shall comprise 3 students. One shall conduct trial on behalf of Plaintiff/Complainant/Petitioner and the other shall conduct trial on behalf of Opponent/Respondent.
5. The third member shall be the Moot Judge, who shall conduct the trial and on the basis of evidence produced before him/her, shall participate in the Judgment Writing Competition to be held on 14th March 2020.
6. Only one team per college shall be permitted to participate with prior intimation.

The Competition shall consist of:

- a) There shall be two rounds, one preliminary and the final round.
- b) All participant teams shall prepare either problem 1 or problem 2 for preliminary round which shall be held on Saturday 14th March 2020, and communicate the same at the time of confirmation.
- c) Four teams from among them shall be selected for final round on Problem No.3 which shall be held on Sunday 15th March 2020.
- d) The judgment writing competition shall be held on Problem No. 1 or 2 which they have chosen for preliminary round, which shall be held on Saturday 14th March 2020.



Rules for Conducting of Trial:

1. The dress code for the Mooters conducting the trial will be white dress with black coat and advocate's band. For the Mooter Judge it would be white dress, black coat with gown and band.
2. The witnesses for the trial for both the preliminary and final rounds will be provided by the host college, they will be well versed with the facts of the case and shall depose exactly as per the facts given in the moot problem.
3. The Mooters would record the evidence orally only i.e. they will take examination in chief and cross examination of the witnesses. They will get the documents that they rely on to be proved as exhibits following the due process of law and submission of affidavits shall not be allowed.
4. Language for the competition shall be English, Hindi or Marathi only. This shall be intimated to the host college in advance in order to prepare the witnesses.
5. A panel of two observers and a moot judge appointed by the host college will assess the competition. Their decision will be final.

Rules of Memorials:

The teams shall prepare two memorials, one for the preliminary round and one for the final round. Each team shall carry two sets of memorials of each side of each round, which shall be precondition to participate in the competition. The memorials shall be typed on Legal size paper with margin in Arial font and of size 12. Last date for submitting memorials online is on or before 29th February 2020. Hard copies of the memorials shall be submitted by the participants on 13th March 2020 by 4:00 pm. The participants who fail to do so will be disqualified.

Oral Submissions:

1. Each team shall be given 40 minutes in all. 30 Minutes to conduct the trial along with examination of two witnesses, and 10 minutes for arguing the case. The Mooters may distribute the time among them.
2. There shall be a warning bell three minutes before completion of the allotted time for each team. There will be a final bell on completion of the allotted time.
3. If any team exceeds the allotted time, except with the permission of the judge, the team shall be abruptly stopped and would be liable for negative marking.



Scoring Criteria:

1. Memorials	:	20 Marks
2. Examination of Witnesses	:	40 Marks
3. Arguments	:	20 Marks
4. Answer to Queries of Court & Court Mannerism	:	20 Marks

Total : 100 Marks

Judgment Writing Competition:

1. The host college will appoint a Judge for the competition and the entire trial will be conducted under his control.
2. The Moot Judge will sit with the judge appointed by the host college to conduct the trial; by this the moot judge will learn how to conduct the trial. However, there shall be no marks allotted for this. The marks allotted are only for judgment writing.
3. Each Mooter Judge shall be given 30 minutes for writing the judgment immediately after the trial, on the problem which the team had selected for trial. The Moot Judge is allowed to keep the evidence notes of the trial, points of arguments, case laws etc. except the copy of earlier written judgment with him while writing the judgment.
4. The Moot Judge may choose any language, either English or Marathi for writing the judgment.
5. The scheme of marking is as follows:

6. The decision of the judges appointed by the host college shall be final.



Other Rules:

1. All participants are expected to maintain full decorum of the court during the competition.
2. All teams should report at 9.00 a.m. on Saturday 14th March 2020.
3. Accommodation shall be provided to participants for the days of the competition.
4. No. TA- DA shall be provided to the participants.
5. Lunch and tea shall be provided to participants for the days of competition.
6. The host college reserves the right to make necessary changes in the rules prescribed hereinabove.

Tips for success in the competition:

1. The easiest way to ensure success in the competition is to take guidance from a practicing trial court advocate.
2. Attending the trial court and observing the proceeding could also help a great deal especially to understand how to conduct the chief and cross examination of witnesses and also to get the documents exhibited.
3. Knowledge of C.P.C., Cr.P.C. and The Evidence Act is a must or a prerequisite for conducting trial. Knowledge of other enactments like (Civil Manual, Criminal Manual) The Suits Valuation Act, Court Fees Act etc. are also essential for drafting of Plaint, W.S., Complaint etc.
4. Unlike a Moot Court the arguments in the Moot Trial are restricted to bringing before the court the evidence proved by witnesses and documents and only briefly stating laws and case laws.
5. The Judgment to be written in the Judgment Writing Competition should be an exact replica of how it would be written by a Trial Court Judge. The format could be taken from standard Judgment Writing books but reading of real judgments from the trial court will be more helpful.
6. The marking for the judgment is given above and focus shall be to see how well the moot judge has appreciated the evidence before him to reach a rational conclusion.
7. The marking for advocate is also given and the focus for this would be skill in conducting



the chief and the cross examinations of the witnesses and getting documents exhibited by them.

8. There is also special prize for excellence in drafting of Plaint, W.S., and Complaint etc. for which the drafts can be taken from good Drafting and Pleading books or help of practicing advocates. It must necessarily be in conformity with the permission of C.P.C. It must be noted that they are not written arguments as given in the moot court. Written arguments are not expected here.

MOOT PROBLEMS

Moot Problem no. 1 :

ABC INDIA LTD. is a company manufacturer of NIKE Baby Wipes in the said company. Mr. PQR was a director after some dispute with the company; Mr. PQR resigned and went out. After two years, ABC India Ltd. found that their yearly sales have dropped by 30%. On inquiry, they found that PQR India Ltd. has entered into same field of manufacturing of baby wipes with a name 'NIKI Baby Wipes. On comparing the products of PQR India Ltd with ABC India Ltd, it was found that the outer boxes of both carried the following images :



ABC found the product of PQR to be deceptively similar and therefore requested PQR to stop the production by name 'NIKI Baby wipes,' and also to change the outer cover of the product. ABC sent a notice to PQR through their advocate. PQR sent a reply to the said notice and flatly refused to change the name and cover, stating that the name NIKI is the name of the daughter of the chairman. Mr. PQR and the cover photo is of Ms. Niki. The product of ABC India Ltd. carrying the photo of Mr. Nike, who is son of chairman Mr. ABC. Because of the deceptively similar product ABC put to losses as there is passing off. The product of ABC has a registered trademark since 1990 without any exceptions. Draft a plaint on behalf of ABC INDIA LTD. against PQR for damages and written statement on behalf of PQR Ltd with possible defenses available.



Moot Problem No. : 2

1. 'A' is a girl aged 20, B is a boy aged 24. On 12/02/2019 'A' lodged complaint in 'Y' Police Station against 'B'.
2. She alleges that she is known to the accused 'B'. They were studying in the same college and were into a relationship. She broke up with him and therefore he started harassing her.
3. The accused 'B' created a website in the name of xyz.com and sent some obscene photographs of the informant by using a false e-mail id of her which was created in the name of pwd@rediffmail.com. He posted obscene photos using this email id on the above mentioned website.
4. The accused 'B' created a false profile on the social media platform i.e. 'facebook' by using the name 'fgk'. He placed the photograph of the informant on the profile id 'fgk'.
5. He later contacted friends and family members of the informant using the 'facebook' profile 'fgk'. After the friend requests were accepted, he sent the link of the false website cde.com which contained the obscene photographs of the informant.
6. The complainant alleges that the accused 'B' has committed the offence under IPC and IT Act 2000. And the offence came to be registered.
 - Draft a FIR to police on behalf of 'A'.
 - Draft reply on behalf of 'B' (optional).
 - Create evidences to support your respective case.

Moot Problem No.: 3 (For final round only)

'A' is the owner of suit premise. 'B' is the tenant in the suit premise staying from 1997. A issued legal notice to claim vacant possession of property. B replied to the notice claiming to hold property in adverse possession.

1. Draft plaint on behalf of 'A' for recovery of possession from B.
2. Draft W.S and counterclaim on behalf of 'B' claim adverse possession

Note:

1. The teams shall give the names to the witnesses and develop their own stories with these brief facts.
2. Only two witnesses are allowed. The participating teams shall choose the characters to be played by these two witnesses and train the witnesses provided by the host college.
3. For problem no. 1 the participants may change the name of the companies and the product, but the theme line of the story shouldn't be changed.
4. Problem number 3 is exclusively for the Final Round.



Rights of workers can be found in Part IV of the Constitution primarily. The country has not found a suitable right to livelihood in Part III of the Indian Constitution because of economic limitations of the state. In this situation right to life with human dignity and the right to shelter have broadly affected also. It has focused on various aspects like the right to medical aid, right to health, right to food, right to transportation must be understood as parts of basic human dignity and an integral part of life under Article 21 of the Constitution.

Most importantly liabilities of contractor and establishment under the provisions of the Inter-State Migrant Workmen (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Services) Act, 1979 have also discussed along with all other statutes which are significant in rights of the workers.

In the end, it has been stated by the Speaker that without migrant workers the states will have turned into economic crisis.
