

## **The Student Satisfaction Survey Report 2019-20**

According to the guidelines of NAAC Students Satisfaction Survey was conducted in this academic year. The questioner was also framed as per the guidelines of NAAC. And the questionnaire was distributed to students by internet and the same was also available on the college website. Students responded to the said questionnaire on the Google form. The data is collected through Google Form only.

The first five questions were formal questions and were related to the student's academic information and authentication of the responding student. The second part of the said questioner is a feedback about the institution and teaching learning process in the institution.

In this second part of the questioner's first question was, How much syllabus covered in the class?

It is observed that eighty four present students responded that at least seventy to hundred present syllabus is covered in the class. It must be noted that this academic year was affected by Covid-19 pandemic and the teaching learning process was through an online medium.

Second question was, how well did the teacher prepare for the classes?

Eighty eight present students responded positively and eighty eight present students said that the teachers were prepared satisfactorily or thoroughly.

Next question was, how well could the teachers be able to communicate?

Seventy seven present students said always effective or sometimes effective. It must be noted that this was the first attempt by the teacher on online teaching.

Next question was, the teacher approach to teaching can be best described as, 1. Excellent 2. Very Good 3. Good 4. Fair 5. Poor.

It was seen that, eighty one per cent of students responded positively and said that the teacher's approach to the teaching can be best described as either Good, Very Good or Excellent.

Next question is about the fairness in the internal evaluation process.

It was noticed that, Eighty three present students responded positively. Eighty three students opted for the Usually Fair or Always Fair options.

Next question is also about fairness in the internal evaluation process.

And it is recorded that, sixty six present students responded that their assessment is discussed with them.

Next question is, The institution takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for the students?

It must be noted that in this phase of Covid 19 and restriction fifty seven present students responded positively to the promotion of internship and field visits.

Next question is about the mentorship available in the college.

Seventy three present students responded that the teaching and mentoring process facilitates the development of students.

The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow. Seventy nine students agreed that the institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.

Next question was, Teachers inform you about the expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes. Seventy two present students positively responded that, teachers informed about the expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.

Next question was, your mentor does necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.

It was found that seventy six students responded positively and recorded that mentors do necessary follow-up with assigned tasks.

Next question was, teachers illustrate the concept through examples and applications. It was found that, eighty present students positively and said that teachers illustrate the concept through examples and applications.

In the next question it is found that, sixty six percent of students responded that teachers identify strengths and provide the right level of challenges to them.

In the next question it is found that, sixty six present students responded that teachers are able to identify weakness and help them to overcome the problems.

In the next question sixty eight present students agreed that the institution makes efforts to encourage the students in mentoring, review and continuous quality improvement of teaching learning process.


About the student centrist method, sixty six present students agreed that the institution / teachers use experimental learning, participative learning and problem solving methodology.
