## **Training Programme 2022-23:**

## 1. Trial Education Programme:

The College has developed a Trial Education Programme (TEP) in association with Nashik Bar Association since 2014-2015. This programme enables the development of basic knowledge and professional attitude in budding lawyers especially with reference to the trial Courts. TEP is organized taking into account the differing needs and interests of students, who in our college mainly hail from the rural areas. Trial in the lower courts is generally the beginning point of the career of most students. In 2022- 23 the TEP was conducted from 18-04-23 to 18-05-23. This programme emphasizes on practical orientation of the students. The main practical aspects covered under the TEP are fundamental rules and procedures of conducting trial. Members of the Nashik Bar Association ( most of who are our alumni) guide students on various themes This year the TEP included sessions on Drafting of Deeds, Investigation of Title and Search Reports, Procedure of Session Trial, Law relating to confession, Recovery & Discovery, Law relating to Bails. Practical aspects of Criminal Trials, Burden of Proof, matrimonial offences, Investigation by Police & Cyber Crimes. The sessions are highly interactive allowing for the transfer of knowledge and experience from senior Lawyers to students through deliberations.

<sup>2.</sup> Moot Trial & Judgment Writing Competition: This competition has been organized by NBT Law College in collaboration with Late. Adv. T Jaibhave Foundation since 2006. In the year 2022-23 we organized the 15<sup>th</sup> edition of this competition. This is a unique competition that gives students the opportunity to understand the procedure of Trail. Many institutions organize Moot Court Competitions but we specifically chose to organize the Moot Trial because it is the foundation of law practice. This competition offers practical legal skills,

courtroom experience, and opportunities for honing research, oral advocacy, and writing abilities. 32 teams from Maharashtra participated in this event and 5 teams reached the Semi Final Round of which the final two teams enthusiastically competed to win the competition. About 200 students from our college were actively involved in the event as witnesses, volunteers, bench clerks & pukarawalas. More than 25 advocates from Nashik Bar Association acted as Presiding Officers & Observers. 17 Prizes worth Rs 100000/- were awarded to the winning and runner up team including sponsored prizes for individual performance in various categories including prizes for the best witness and volunteers.
