The talaq was communicated to Zara on 25/01/2024. Zara is presently living separately from Ashfaq. Discuss the validity of triple talaq and various remedies available to Zara.
- b) Anil and Sunita, both Hindus wished to get married in France near the Eiffel Tower. Anil has acquired French citizenship, whereas Sunita is an Indian citizen. Advise Anil and Sunita as regards the applicability of Indian laws for solemnisation of marriage in France.
- c) Rahul, aged 28 years and Shweta aged 26 years, have been living together since last five years. Both, being unmarried, consensually decided to live together without solemnisation of marriage. Lately, Rahul is pressurising Shweta to get married. Her reluctance has often resulted in violent fights between them, causing physical, mental and emotional injury to Shweta. Shweta intends to end her relationship with Rahul and seeks maintenance from Rahul. Advise Shweta.
- d) Rustom and Dolla, both Parsis married with each other under the Special Marriage Act, 1954. Dolla has recently converted to Christianity and adopted Christian way of life. Dolla's conversion has greatly affected Rustom. He cannot cope with this change and wishes to separate from Dolla. Advise Rustom.
- e) Sanjay married Vinita following Hindu rites and ceremonies. Soon after the marriage, Vinita met with an accident, which caused severe injuries to her. Vinita is paralysed and unable to perform any of her tasks independently. Sanjay later married Ritika without dissolving his marriage with Vinita. Discuss the impact of Vinita's illness on the validity of the marriage between Sanjay and Vinita. Additionally discuss the validity of the marriage between Sanjay and Ritika.
