### **Admission Procedure, Rules & Regulations (For Law Programmes)**

- a) According to G. R. No. CET-2015/C.R.379/M.S. HI-2 Dated 4<sup>th</sup> December, 2015 and /G.R.No. CET-2016/F.No.84/mshi-2, Dated 7<sup>th</sup> April, 2016, the Competent Authority (CET Cell) conducts the MH CET for the admission to the First Year of LL.B.[3 Years] and the

**Other Rules:**

- A) Admission to first year LL.B and B.A.LL.B. (5 Year) will be as per the Govt. of Maharashtra rules.
- B) Admission to Diploma, PG Degree & Ph. D. will be as per the rules given by Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune.

**C) General Rules:**

- 1) Admission to all programmes is granted in the month of June / July only. The academic year for all programmes generally commences from 15th June and concludes on 30th April of the subsequent year. Students are advised to see the notice board for commencement and conclusion of the term, etc.
- 2) Application for admission to programmes other than LL.B.I and B.A.LL.B I shall be made online. The details of which are available on our website [www.nbtcollege.com](http://www.nbtcollege.com)
- 3) The Application form for Admission shall be available in the College Office on payment of the prescribed fees between 10.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. on all working days.
- 4) Application for admission duly completed shall be accompanied by remittance of necessary fees, original certificates required (with two photocopies of each document) and two passport-size recent photographs.

The following documents are required:

- (a) Duly completed Application form for Admission.
- (b) Passing Certificate of the Qualifying Examination.
- (c) Statements of marks of the Qualifying Examination.
- (d) Transfer Certificate / Leaving Certificate (if pending)
- (e) Migration Certificate - Original with photocopy.
- (f) 2 photocopies of each certificate & statement of marks.
- (g) Two passport-size recent photographs.
- (h) Fee concession forms for E. B. C./ B. C. Students.
- (i) Affidavit for - Educational Gap (if any)
- (j) Caste Certificate

(k) Certificate of Date of Birth

(l) Bank Account No. (for scholarship purposes)

(m) Aadhar Card.

(n) Affidavits/Undertakings as required

(o) Prescribed fee in full

- 6) Mere submission of an application for admission with the necessary remittance and other documents doesn't amount to "admission". **The Principal reserves the right to grant admission, and every admission is required to be confirmed by the authorities of the College, SP University of Pune, DHE & ARA, as applicable.**
- 7) An application for admission without a transfer certificate may not be accepted, and if accepted, it remains provisional and pending full compliance.
- 8) Acceptance of application for admission with the necessary remittance and documents, but without the Transfer Certificate / Migration Certificate / Eligibility Certificate (as the case may be), does not amount to admission. It is only a provisional acceptance of the application for admission. Such an applicant shall not be a bona fide student of the College. (Even though his/her name appears on the roll call of students.)

**The Principal reserves the right to remove the name of such student from the roll of students at any time.**

- 9) If admission is not granted or if the name of such applicant is removed from the roll of the students, the amount remitted by the applicant will be refunded after deducting the amount as per the rules of the University.
- 10) If admission is granted but is not availed by the applicant, the amount remitted stands forfeited and will not be refunded.
- 11) Applicants desirous of taking admission to any of the courses in the college are advised to submit their application forms in person immediately after the declaration of the results of the qualifying examination for such admission.
- 12) Perusal of Notices displayed on the notice board is mandatory for all admitted students. No personal correspondence will be made with the students to give any directives/notices. College will not

be held responsible for non-compliance by the student regarding such notices/directives.

**d) Candidates migrating from other universities/institutions:**

An applicant coming from any other Indian (statutory) University shall obtain permission from DHE (For all granted programmes only) & the Eligibility Certificate from the Savitribai Phule Pune University. For such an Eligibility Certificate, one has to apply to the Registrar, Savitribai Phule Pune University, Ganeshkhind, Pune-7, in the prescribed form with the necessary fee, along with a photocopy of the following documents:

- (a) Passing Certificate of the qualifying examination.
- (b) Statement of marks of the qualifying examination.
- (c) Character Certificate from the college last attended.
- (d) Transfer Certificate from the college/university last attended - Original.
- (e) Migration Certificate - Original.
- (f) Application form to secure the Eligibility Certificate from the University of Pune.
- (g) Photocopies of the above documents.
- (h) Undertakings etc.

**e) Mode of Payment of Fees:**

- 1) Students are required to pay full fees for both terms at the time of admission.
- 2) Admission will be granted on full payment of fees as per the schedule.
- 3) Refund of Fees on Cancellation of Admission:  
The refund of the fees if the student cancels the admission shall be as per the rules of University, UGC & Govt. of Maharashtra.

**f) Refund of Deposits:**

The following are the rules for the refund of deposits:

- 1) Library deposit & other deposits (if any) will be refundable only at the time of leaving the College.

- 2) Such deposits will be refunded to the students during the period from 15th July to 15th September only, after deducting the losses, if any.
- 3) Deposits shall not be refunded unless the original receipts and clearance certificate from the Librarian are produced.
- 4) Deposits will be refunded in person only.
- 5) The deposits not claimed within 12 months from the date of the end of the previous academic year stand automatically forfeited.

**g) Scholarships:**

- 1) Students entitled for Scholarship shall declare the type of Government Scholarship to which he or she is eligible and shall produce documentary evidence at the time of admission.
- 2) Students entitled to such Scholarship shall be admitted on payment of reduced fee considering award of such Scholarship. If the Scholarship is not awarded, the student will have to pay the remaining college fees immediately.
- 3) Such students are required to submit their application for Scholarship (In the prescribed proforma) and/or other essential documents to the College Office within eight days from the date of their college admission. This will enable the College to forward its cases to the relevant government offices without delay. It will also help students in getting the Scholarship as early as possible.
- 4) If any such student fails to apply for Scholarship or his application is rejected for any reason, the student shall pay the fees immediately.
- 5) Students shall take the College admission at the earliest and in any case, before 30th June in order to fulfil the attendance and progress requirements laid down by the Government.
- 6) Students availing scholarship facility are directed to submit their Bank Account No. & a undertaking in the prescribed format at the time of admission.
- 7) Students belonging to SC/NT/OBC/SBC/EWS/Minority etc are required to fill the online freeship/scholarship forms along

with required documents. Printout of online submission is required to be submitted to the College Administrative office.

## LIBRARY

The library has a rich collection of 39000 law books, reference books and periodicals. It subscribes to over 14 legal magazines including some of the leading foreign periodicals. A large number of periodicals are also received in the library. The library offers Reading room facility usually between 8.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. It also provides home lending facility to the students.

Following are some of the important library rules:

- Every student has to show Identity card while borrowing a book.
  - Only One book will be issued at a time.
  - Students are advised to check the book before leaving the counter.
  - Library material should be handling with care. If it is found that a student has tried to tear the pages or damaged the book. The concerned student will have to pay the cost of the book.
  - Book should be returned within a week or before date, failing which a fine of Rs.2.00 (Rupees Two) per day will be charged.
  - Due date of an issued book, if not in demand, may be renewed at the discretion of the Librarian or the Counter assistant
  - Students shall maintain discipline in the library & college premises. If any student found to have breached the discipline, a fine of **Rs. 100/-** (Rupees Hundred only) shall be levied/imposed if students do not observe the discipline & decorum.
  - Students should follow the queue system while collecting and depositing the books.

## VEHICLE PARKING

Students must park their vehicles in the notified vehicle parking area for the students. They should not bring/park their vehicles in the College premises. Parking the vehicle in front of the College building or at non parking area

is strictly prohibited & a fine of Rs. 500 shall be imposed for wrong parking or unauthorised entry of vehicle inside the campus.

## DISCIPLINE

- 1) Every student of the College shall abide by the rules & discipline of the College.
- 2) Every student seeking admission to this College shall give the following undertaking.

**“I hereby agree, if admitted, to confirm to the rules and regulations at present in force or that may hereafter be made for the governance of the College, and I undertake that so long as I am a student of the College, I will do nothing either inside or outside the College that will interfere with its orderly governance and discipline. I further declare that I shall not take part in any movement which is likely to be subversive of law and order and if found to indulge in such kind of activity, the Principal reserves the right of cancelling the admission of the concerned student as disciplinary action.”**

- 3) Every student shall also make the following declaration.

**“I hereby submit to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and the Officers and authorities of the University / and Director-Principal and the authorities of the College and of Gokhale Education Society and shall observe and abide by the rules made by the Vice-Chancellor in that behalf and also by the Society and the Director and the Principal of the College.”**

- 4) Students must observe complete silence and discipline in the College premises. They must not loiter in the passages and corridors. They are advised to sit quietly in the library and spend their spare time in such a way as not to cause any disturbance to the work of others. Absolute silence must be observed in the library as well as in the classrooms and on the campus.
- 5) Students must be punctual in attendance and be in their seats at least 5 minutes before the start of lectures.
- 6) No person shall be invited to address or to entertain the students of the College without the prior written permission of the principal.

- 7) Subjects of debates or events, pieces of entertainment in the College shall be first approved by the principal.

A responsible person approved or nominated by the Principal shall be in the chair at all College debates and social functions.

- 8) All the departments of the College (Gymkhana, Library, club, Legal Aid Clinic, NSS, etc.) will work according to rules made on that behalf by the management.
- 9) Students must keep their terms strictly in accordance with the rules of the College /University and the Bar Council of India.
- 10) Every student of the College must have an Identity Card. He/She should always carry it with him/her in and out of the college and produce it whenever called upon to do so by the relevant authorities.
- 11) In case of loss of Identity Card, a duplicate Card will be issued on submission of an undertaking regarding the loss, on payment of a fee of Rs. 100/- only.
- 12) It is compulsory for all the law students (LL. B. and B.A., LL.B.) to present themselves in the prescribed dress code in the college premises, failing which students will not be entertained in the College, nor they are permitted to attend the classes.

### **Prescribed Dress Code for LL.B. and B.A., LL.B.**

**Boys:** White Shirt and Black Trousers

**Girls:** White Kameez/Kurti, Black Dupatta and Black Salwar/Trousers.

**The dress should be full, and not be revealing, tight or half sleeves. Slim fit or tight fit uniform is strictly prohibited.**

- 13) Use of a mobile phone in the college premises is strictly prohibited. Students who opt for Mobile use will be subject to disciplinary action.
- 14) No outsider is allowed to enter the College premises without the permission of the principal. Trespassers are liable for prosecution.
- 15) Smoking, drinking (Alcohol), chewing of paan, guthka, tobacco, etc. and spitting is strictly prohibited in the College building and College premises.

- 16) The college timing will be as follows:

- a) Diploma and Master's Degree Classes: Morning 8.00 a.m. to 12.30 p.m.
- b) LL. B II to III & B.A.LL.B.IV to V: 8.00 am to 1.00 pm
- c) B.A.LL.B. I to III & LL.B.I: 11.30 pm. to 5.00 pm.

### **ANTI-RAGGING: ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY**

#### **Anti-Ragging Committees & Squads:**

The College has constituted various committees & Squads such as Anti-Ragging Committee, Anti-Ragging Squad, Internal Complaints Committee, Students Council, Disciplinary Committee, etc. as per the rules of Savitribai Phule Pune University & Govt. of Maharashtra.

#### **Action against Ragging:**

Ragging is a severe, punishable crime. Any student found guilty of participating in or abetting ragging on or off campus will face immediate suspension, withheld exam results, forfeiture of scholarships, and hostel eviction. Depending on the severity, the institution will cancel admissions, rusticate offenders, or issue a permanent expulsion alongside a mandatory five-year ban from all educational institutions across India

Legally, the college must file a police FIR within 24 hours. A conviction carries up to three years of rigorous imprisonment and fines up to ₹1 Lakh. Crucially, a permanent criminal record will disqualify the individual from corporate employment, government jobs, and passport issuance. Protect your future and keep our campus safe.

#### **ATTENDANCE:**

Every student admitted to N. B. Thakur Law College, Nashik, is required to regularly attend lectures, workshops, seminars, practical training sessions, court visits, moot courts, guest lectures, and other academic activities conducted by the college. No student shall claim exemption from attendance on grounds such as employment or any other personal engagement.

As per University rules, at least 75% attendance is compulsory throughout the session, failing which a student will not be allowed to appear for the University Examination.

The admission of the student not attending the lectures/seminars/ practicals, etc., stands cancelled automatically. The decision of the Principal, in this respect, shall be final and binding.

**Internal Exams:** The Internal Exams of all the classes conducted by the college are compulsory, and every student should score at least 40% in each subject. If the student remains absent for the said Exam, he will be marked absent. In special cases (for a genuine reason), the student will be allowed to appear for the exam on payment of fine as per the College rules.

For the new syllabus 2023, the Choice Based Credit system (CBCS) pattern, the exams will be as per the semester pattern of SPPU.

#### **Disciplinary Action:**

In case of non-compliance of any rule/s by the student and continuous non-observance of the rules framed by the G. E. Society or College, the Principal is empowered to take disciplinary action him including cancellation of admission, issuance of T.C. (Leaving Certificate) to the concerned students and/or fine.

#### **Law Degree - Not an External Programme**

The LL.B./BALLB Degree Programme course or any other course leading to the university degree or diploma under the Faculty of Law of the Savitribai Phule Pune University is NOT an external course. Every student undertaking any such course, therefore, must keep terms as per University rules and to the satisfaction of the Principal.

Rules Regarding Admission, Examination, ATKT, and B.O.P. will apply to students as per the circulars and notifications, and the decisions of Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune.

The directives of the Bar Council of India and U.G.C. will be implemented for the conduct of programmes.

#### **PRACTICAL TRAINING**

It is compulsory for all LL. B. III (3-year Programme) and B.A. LL.B.- V Year Students (5 Year Programme) to undergo the Practical Training consisting of-

- 1) Attendance at the Court;
- 2) Observance of the Court Proceedings;
- 3) Presentation of Moot Courts, etc.
- 4) Attendance at the Advocate's chamber
- 5) Maintenance of the diary of the above activities

Non-Compliance with any part of Practical Training will be treated as absence of the student in the subject, and No Marks will be allotted against such non-compliance.

#### **Commencement Of Profession And The Professional Sanad:**

Under the prescribed rules of the Bar Council of India, one must complete the Three-year degree programme or the five-year BALLB. Degree programme successfully and obtain the LLB/BALLB degree for the professional Sanad.

As per the Bar Council of India circular (DLE/109/2010) of 16<sup>th</sup> Aug. 2010, for enrolment as advocates under section 24 of the Advocates Act, 1961, law students graduating from academic year 2009-2010 and onwards shall have to clear the 'All India Bar Examination' (AIBE) in order to practice law in India. The Examination shall be conducted by the BAR COUNCIL OF INDIA. Upon successfully clearing the AIBE, an advocate will be permitted to practice law in India and will receive a 'Certificate of Practice' from BCI.

## **Post Graduate Programmes**

### **Master of Laws (LL.M.)**

#### **Eligibility for Admission:**

To be eligible for admission, the candidate must be a law graduate (LLB/BALLB/BBALLB) either of this University or of any other University whose degrees are recognised as equivalent to the corresponding degrees of this University.

#### **Duration of the Programme:**

The duration of the Programme shall be two Academic Years, commencing from June (any changes to this effect will be subject to the rules of the University), and shall comprise four semesters.

#### **Ph. D. Research Programme:**

The College has established a Ph.D. Research Centre, inaugurated at the auspicious hands of Hon'ble Justice Shri Bhushan Gavai, Chief Justice of India, on 27 September 2026. The Centre is headed by Dr. Harunrashid A. Kadri as Director, while Dr. Bharat G. Kaurani serves as the Coordinator.

The Research Centre is well-equipped with the guidance of eight learned and recognised research supervisors, supported by dedicated administrative and academic staff. It also provides access to a rich collection of reputed national and international journals, reference books, research publications, and other scholarly reading materials, thereby creating a conducive environment for advanced legal research and academic excellence.

#### **NOTES:**

As per savitribai phule pune university circulars notified from time to time, a candidate who has not passed all the subjects of any particular programme during the validity period of the term. (i.e. N+2 years, 'n' is the number of years required for any

degree/diploma as per rules) shall not be eligible to appear for that particular examination after the lapse of term.
